

On line Safety -Taught throughout computing curriculum - Through assemblies, -Parent awareness sessions -Safer Internet Day -Specific group and 1:1 activities responding to needs of cohorts, Sexting – age appropriate activities around the use of social networking and online relationships, Healthy Me prepares younger children. Curriculum Monitoring events.

Fire and Water Safety - Fire visitors and visits – assemblies/workshops – Swimming lessons, Y5/6 residential visits – canoeing and raft building - Fire drills

Children Missing In Education - PSHE topics – belonging, our area - celebration of achievements – it's good to be me topic, Citizenship – British Values -School values and ethos built into the culture. Attendance monitoring and ATTEND initiative

Female Genital Mutilation -How to be physically and emotional safe -NSPCC – 'PANTS' - Children are taught what part of their bodies are private and about privacy -Children signposted where to go for help.

Child Sexual Exploitation -NSPCC workshop -Specific group and 1:1 activities responding to needs of cohorts - SRE/healthy relationships lessons.

Child on Child Abuse Anti-Bullying Week, work planned into Computing curriculum, On-line safety curriculum, Desktop screen message to share rules for keeping safe, Children signposted for where to go for help, 6Rs
