Key Vocabulary

Skara Brae— A tone Age settlement on an island off of Scotland.

Farming — A way of growing plants and raising different animals.

Village— A small number of houses close together. Settlement—A place where a group of people have

set up a village, town or city.

Crops— Plants that have grown.

Physical Feature—A natural feature such as water, mountains, deserts and lakes.

Human Feature— Something that has been made or built by a person.

Enabling Knowledge

-There are surviving remains of Stone Age and Iron Age settlements across the UK.
