Focus: What is a Christian and what do they believe?

Intent

Key Vocabulary

Bible - A collection of religious texts scared in Christianity.

Christmas - A holy day that marks the birth of Jesus, the son of God.

Christ - A name and a title synonymous with Jesus.

Prayer - Talking to God. The one way of communicating with God.

Worship - any act that shows devotion to or love for God.

What should I already know?


What is a Jew and what do they believe? To know that some people believe in God. Recognise Christian symbols.

Enabling Knowledge

- Talk about the fact that Christians believe in God and follow the example of Jesus
- Recognise some Christian symbols and images used to express ideas about God.
- Talk about some simple ideas about Christian beliefs about God and Jesus.
- Re-tell a story that shows what Christians might think about God, in words, drama and pictures, suggesting what it means.
- Talk about issues of good and bad, right and wrong arising from the stories.
- Ask some questions about believing in God and offer some ideas of their own.
